TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS PER IATF RESOLUTION NO. 159 Effective 01 February 2022




The Philippine Consulate General in Guam informs the public that the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF) has announced that the classification of countries/territories/jurisdictions as “Green,” “Yellow,” and “Red” shall be temporarily suspended pursuant to IATF Resolution no. 159, Series of 2022, dated 27 January 2022.

Effective 01 February 2022, the entry, testing, and quarantine protocols for international arriving Filipinos and foreign nationals allowed entry into the country (“international arriving passengers”) shall be as follows, **regardless of their country of origin**:

Here are the entry, testing, and quarantine protocols for international arriving Filipinos and foreign nationals who will be allowed to enter the country regardless of their country of origin effective Tuesday, February 1, 2022:

-  Fully-vaccinated international arriving passengers shall be required to present a negative RT-PCR test taken within 48 hours prior to departure from the country of origin.
-  No need to undergo mandatory facility-based quarantine upon arrival.
-  Self-monitoring will be observed for any sign or symptom for seven (7) days. If there is any symptom, he/she will be required to report to the local government unit of destination.

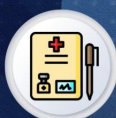
Fully-vaccinated international arriving passengers must have the following

permitted by the IATF

GUIDELINES FOR INT'L ARRIVING PASSENGERS UNDER TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF CLASSIFICATION OF COUNTRIES, TERRITORIES, JURISDICTIONS



For unvaccinated, partially vaccinated, or individuals whose
vaccination status cannot be independently validated, they
will be required to present a negative RT-PCR test taken
within 48 hours prior to departure from the country of origin.



Required to undergo facility-based quarantine until the release
of their negative RT-PCR test taken on the 5th day.



Required to undergo home quarantine until their 14th day,
with the date of arrival being the first day. Local government units
of destination and their respective BHERTs are tasked to monitor
those arriving passengers undergoing home quarantine.



Children below twelve (12) years of age who cannot be
vaccinated shall follow the quarantine protocols of the parent/s
or the accompanying adult/guardian traveling with them.



Those who are currently undergoing quarantine as of
February 1, 2022 may avail of the aforementioned testing and
quarantine protocols.

Furthermore, effective 10 February 2022:

Fully vaccinated nationals of non-visa required countries (**such as the United States of America**) under Executive Order No. 408 (s.1960), as amended, shall be allowed to enter the Philippines, subject to the following conditions:

- a. Holders of passports valid for at least six (6) months at the time of arrival, and with return or outbound ticket to their country of origin or next country of destination.
- b. Must have the following proofs of vaccination against COVID-19 recognized under existing IATF regulations:
 - i. World Health Organization International Certificates of Vaccination and Prophylaxis;
 - ii. VaxCertPH; or
 - iii. National/state digital certificate of the foreign government which has accepted VaxCertPH under a reciprocal arrangement unless otherwise permitted by the IATF.
- c. Children below eighteen (18) years of age are exempted from the requirement of full vaccination and providing proof of vaccination status prior to boarding.
- d. Shall observe the existing testing and quarantine protocols in place for fully vaccinated international arriving passengers in all ports of entry.

- f. Fully vaccinated nationals shall not be included in the arrival quota set by the Department of Transportation and its One-Stop-Shop.
